\$4.23 Million Energy Performance Project Passes Overwhelmingly

Homer Schools recently passed a \$4.23 million Energy Performance Project in a community-wide vote. The project will improve a number of energy issues district-wide while enhancing the learning environment for students at no cost to district taxpayers.

The project will install new LED lighting systems, upgrades to the HVAC system and provide new building control and building envelope upgrades.

Once completed the district will save over eight hundred metric tons of greenhouse gas emmissions annually. That is the emmissions equivalent of over two million miles driven in a car!

Homer FFA Students Visit State Capital


